To bring together our community of partners who support the children of Mabton.

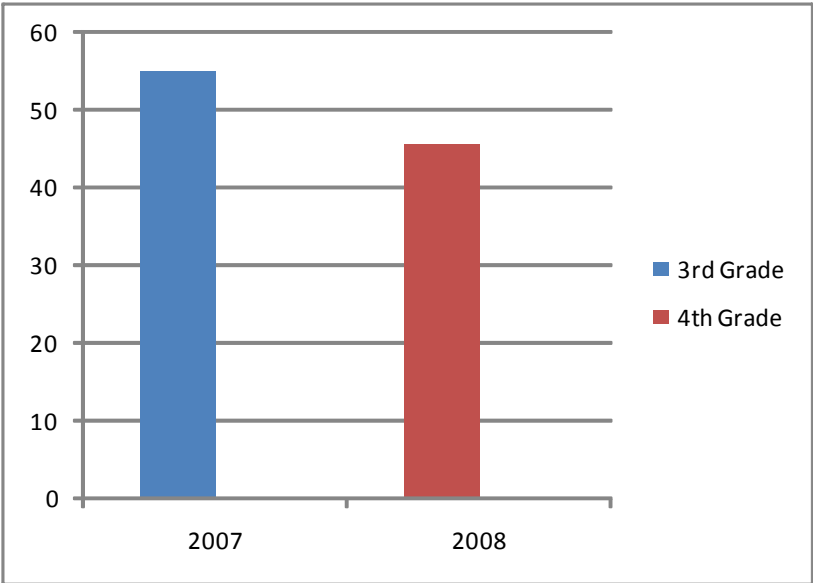
Why get involved?

To help unite the community and promote the steps that ensure our students graduate with the abilities to be successful in college, work and life.

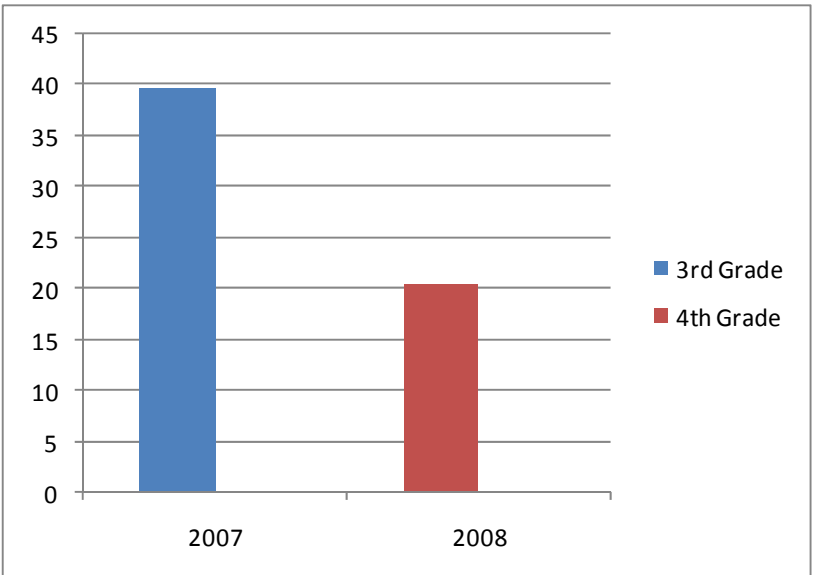


WASL SCORES

Fourth Grade Reading

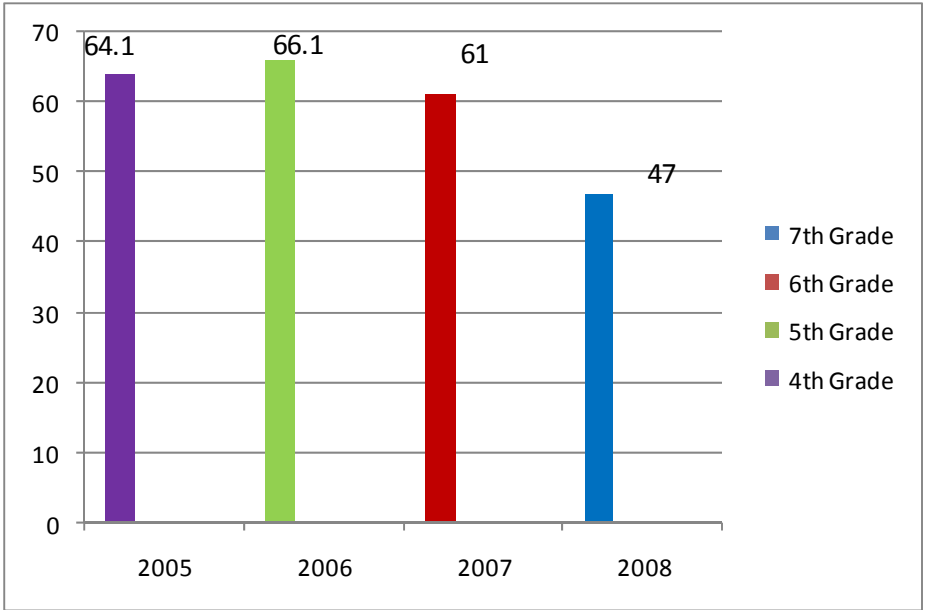


Fourth Grade Math

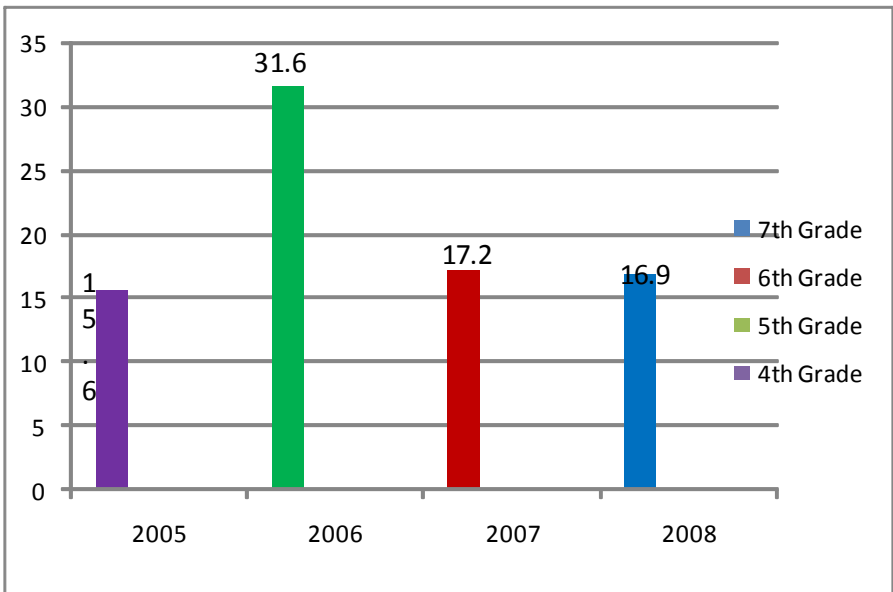

Seventh Grade Reading

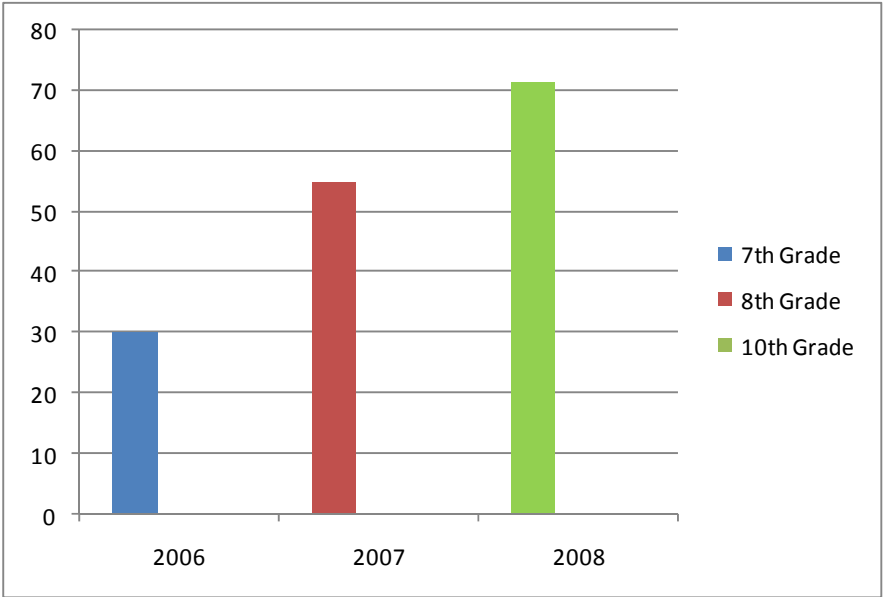


Seventh Grade Math

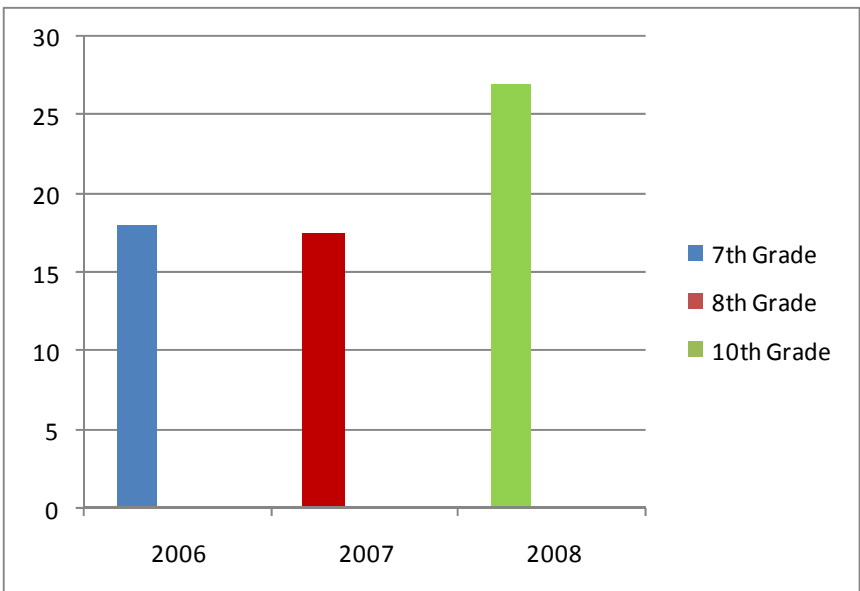

District Improvement Goals for 2011

1. Ninety percent (90%) of all our students will meet grade level standards in Reading and Writing, as measured by the WASL in 2011.
2. Sixty five percent (65%) of all our students will meet grade level standards in Mathematics, as measured by the WASL in 2011.
3. Develop a clear and more collaborative relationship between the Mabton School District and the community to improve student achievement; to better engage families in their children's education.
4. System wide policies ensure that data inform decision making and drives resources aligned with our targets: 90% Literacy and 65% Mathematics achieved in a family friendly— family oriented school.
